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Evaluation Of Concussion Post Concussion

- Physician Evaluation is particularly relevant for medical evaluation and management of concussion. It is also critical for evaluating and managing focal neurologic, sensory, vestibular, and motor concerns. It may be useful for medication management (e.g., headaches, sleep disturbance, depression) if post-concussive problems persist.

Acute Concussion Evaluation

Buffalo Concussion Treadmill Test (BCTT) to evaluate physiological readiness to RTP after concussion BCTT is safe in concussed patients with prolonged symptoms (Clinical Journal of Sport Medicine 20(1):21-27, 2010) BCTT is reliable in evaluation of concussed patients. • High IRR • Good RTR (Clinical Journal of Sport Medicine 21:89-94, 2011.)

Concussion Testing and Evaluation - HPN Concussion Management

On presentation, the primary care provider should conduct a comprehensive review of every patient who has sustained concussion/mTBI (see Appendix 1.1). The assessment should include taking a history, examination and cognitive screen for post-concussive symptoms, and review of mental health (see Table 1.2).

Assessment and Management of Concussion in Sports ...

Post-concussion syndrome. A small proportion of people (15% to 20%) may have symptoms including headaches, dizziness and thinking difficulties that persist beyond three weeks. If these symptoms persist beyond three months, this becomes characterized as post-concussion syndrome.

The diagnosis of a sport-related concussion (SRC) is a clinical diagnosis based on salient features from the history and examination. Although different tests are used to evaluate an athlete with suspected concussion initially, no single test score can be the basis of a concussion diagnosis.

UPDATE: EVALUATION AND MANAGEMENT OF CONCUSSION IN SPORTS

Post-concussion syndrome describes a group of three or more symptoms that persist after a concussion, sometimes for months or years. Common complaints include headache, cervical pain, photophobia and visual dysfunction, noise sensitivity and tinnitus, dizziness, balance and coordination problems, and fatigue.

Signs and symptoms of a concussion may not appear until hours or days after the injury.
